

OUR PROGRAMS



Rescue, Rehabilitation, & Forever Home:

GLR rescues and rehabilitates farm animals who have been abandoned, neglected or are at-risk. Many of our residents come in sick, have debilitating chronic illnesses or become sick later in life due to the neglect in their earlier years. Excellence in care, quality of life, enrichment, proper nutrition and appropriate husbandry and housing are the cornerstones of this program.



Education:

Rescue alone can't solve the problem of limited space and unmatched demand for rescue of farm animals. Education is a critical component to have larger impact and evoke long term change. Currently, GLR educates the public through tours, open houses, outreach and social media. Connecting people with the animals and giving them a rich experience is crucial.



Volunteering:

GLR is mostly volunteer run. To give our volunteers an impactful experience and ample opportunities to bring their skills in, we developed several training programs. The training programs are geared towards animal husbandry, training and proper animal care.

Two Lives Saved!



Moose & Dinka are alive today because of your support!

After ten years with their owner, their lives were turned upside down again. The owner was about to loose his property due to divorce and no one had space to take these two sweet souls in.

Desperate, he called a wolf sanctuary and offered their meat to them. His plan was to shoot them.

The tide turned that day for Dinka & Moose.

The wolf sanctuary connected with us and in a joint effort we were able to safe these two boys.

I have seen and experienced the strengthening of bonds between humans and animals through the education and outreach initiatives offered by The Good Life Rescue community. I'm continually encouraged by the focus on participation, the value placed on community and the shared human (and animal) experience, and the framework of transparency and commitment (both to the animals entrusted to their care, and to those members of the Good Life Rescue community) that underpins the organization.




